

HOW TO REGISTER YOUR AUNGER PRO-TRAILER

Please Note: These steps are only an indication of the procedure to register your Aunger Pro-Trailer. They are accurate at time of printing and consultation should be sought from your local main roads authority for up-to-date information

Queensland

Please note: This information only relates to light trailers. A light trailer is a trailer with an Aggregate Trailer Mass (ATM) up to 3500 kg. You can register your light trailer at any customer service centre or Queensland Transport agent.

You will need the following documents to register the trailer:

- A completed application form. [Click here](#) (PDF, 226kb*) to download the form. If the trailer is 750 kg ATM or less and only has a single axle, then a completed Self Assessment of Single Axle Trailers (ATM 750 kg or less - no brakes fitted) form must also be completed. [Click here](#) (PDF, 502kb*) to download the form.

Weighbridge certificates or statements are not required for trailers where an accurate tare weight can be obtained from another source for example manufacturers plate, owner's manual and so on.

- [Evidence of identification](#). You will need your Queensland driver licence. If you do not hold a current Queensland driver licence, complete a [new customer application form](#) (PDF, 160kb*).
- You will need to produce proof of your Queensland garage address (Queensland driver licence, rates notice, gas, telephone or electricity bill).
- Proof of origin of the vehicle for example bill of sale (receipt from retailer), interstate certificate of registration, previous registration certificate.

Once you bring all of these documents to Queensland Transport, pay the registration costs. To find your local office, visit:

You will be issued a registration number plate for the trailer and a receipt for the transaction once the process is complete, and all the fees are paid.

You must then affix the number plate to the trailer at the rear within 24 hours. The registration label, once it arrives via post, must be affixed adjacent to the plate.

The registration sticker will arrive within five to ten working days of payment of the registration.

New South Wales

Take the trailer to an Authorised Unregistered Vehicle Inspection Station (AUVIS)

Contact the RTA center for these locations: 132213

You will be assigned a blue slip after inspection.

Go to the motor registry with:

- Proof of identity (current NSW drivers license)
 - o If you do not have a current NSW drivers license, you must take 3 forms of identification, at least one showing the primary address where the trailer will be stored
- Inspection Report (blue slip)
- A receipt for the trailer from the retailer

The attendant at the motor registry will complete registration.

Ensure the trailer plate and registration are attached to the trailer as specified by the RTA of NSW.

Australian Capital Territory

Take your assembled trailer straight to the Dixon motor registry for inspection. The trailer must be driven directly to the inspection station. Bookings are essential, call 132281 for bookings.

Take with you:

- Proof of purchase. Receipt with details of purchase and store location
- Proof of identity – Current ACT license
 - o If you do not hold a current ACT license, you must bring 3 forms of ID, such as an interstate license and a medicare card or bank card, along with proof of address where the trailer will be primarily stored (phone or rates bill)

Upon completion of inspection, registration can be acquired inside the office at Dixon (no booking required for this). Charges will apply for this registration and you should consult the office at Dixon for more information on current rates.

Victoria

It is not a requirement to register your Aunger Pro-Trailer in Victoria, unless you fail one of the following criteria:

A trailer which is exempt from registration is one which:
is not used for business purposes, and
is not specifically constructed to carry a boat, and
weighs less than 200kg unladen, and
is not wider than the towing vehicle, and
is less than three metres in length, including the draw-bar and load.

Exempt trailers must display the same registration number as the towing vehicle. You can purchase an 'Exempt Trailer Plate' for \$24.50 (current at time of publication) by:

- calling VicRoads on 13 11 71 (Mon-Sat 8.30am - 5.00pm). You can pay by credit card (Visa, Mastercard or Bankcard)
- visiting a VicRoads office (Mon-Thu 8.30am - 4.30pm; Fri 8.30am - 5.00pm). You can pay by cash, cheque, EFTPOS or credit card.

Exempt trailers may be registered upon request. Note: In many other States, including New South Wales and South Australia, all trailers require registration. If you intend towing your trailer interstate, it is recommended that you register it in Victoria before you travel.

Requirements to register a light trailer

Trailers manufactured after 1989 must have a compliance plate displaying the following:

- manufacturer's name
- date of manufacture
- aggregate trailer mass (in kg)
- vehicle identification number
- tyre and rim data (ie. rim size, tyre size, load rating and recommended tyre pressure)
- trailer model (if applicable)
- the statement "This trailer was manufactured to comply with the applicable Australian Design Standards".

A roadworthy certificate is not required, but light trailers must be in a roadworthy condition.

Trailers with 750kg GVM or less

Trailers with a GVM of 750kg or less do not need to be inspected, however you will need to obtain and complete a Light Trailer Pack before attending an office to register your trailer. A Light Trailer Pack, or information regarding the technical standards for trailers, can be obtained by either:

- calling VicRoads on 13 11 71 (Mon-Sat 8.30am - 5.00pm)
- visiting a VicRoads office (Mon-Thu 8.30am - 4.30pm; Fri 8.30am - 5.00pm).

You will need to make an appointment if you are registering your trailer at any VicRoads office.

Tasmania

Take the trailer to an Authorized inspection station – call 1300 851225 for these locations
A standard inspection will be performed.

Take the report, along with proof of purchase (receipt) and proof of identity to a service Tasmania office.

Charges apply to the registration of the trailer and you should enquire with Service Tasmania for current applicable charges

South Australia

Once the trailer is built:

* an unregistered vehicle permit will be required for the purpose of taking the trailer for an inspection will also need to be obtained from a Transport SA or Service SA Customer Service Centre (unfortunately, not over the telephone) - the fee for the permit will be \$6.00;

* If the owner resides within a 40 kilometre radius of the Adelaide GPO, the trailer can be inspected at either the:

Driver and Vehicle Operations Section, 10 Kateena Street, Regency Park. No appointment is necessary and inspections are conducted Monday to Friday between 8.00am and 4.00 pm (except public holidays)

Or

329 Sturt Road Bedford Park. No appointment is necessary and inspections are conducted Wednesdays and Thursdays between 9.00am and 3.00pm.

If the owner resides in a country area, they may be able to have the trailer inspected at their local Police Station. It is strongly suggested the new owner contact their local Police Station to arrange an appointment for the inspection and to determine if this service is available.

* Once the trailer has been inspected an inspection certificate will be issued;

* An "Application For Registration And Third Party Insurance" form will need to be completed and lodged with the inspection certificate at a Transport SA or Service SA Customer Service Centre when registering the trailer;

* The new owner will be required to pay a plate fee, administration fee, and registration fee. The number plate, registration certificate and label will be issued over the counter.

Western Australia

Take the trailer to a vehicle examination center:

Upon receiving a roadworthy certificate, the trailer can then be registered at this location. Charges will apply and you should contact your local DPI office for current applicable charges.

Northern Territory

Take the trailer (assembled) to the Goyder Rd Customer service center, no appointment is required.

Have them complete a Compliance inspection – a white compliance report will be issued, take next door to service center, along with proof of ownership (receipt of purchase) and proof of I.D (NT drivers license, otherwise 3 forms of ID – at least one with an address)

Complete an R-11 form – registration for a trailer then pay the associated charges for registration. For current charges please contact your local MVR office.

If you are unable to take your trailer to Parap, call their office for an alternate inspection location
